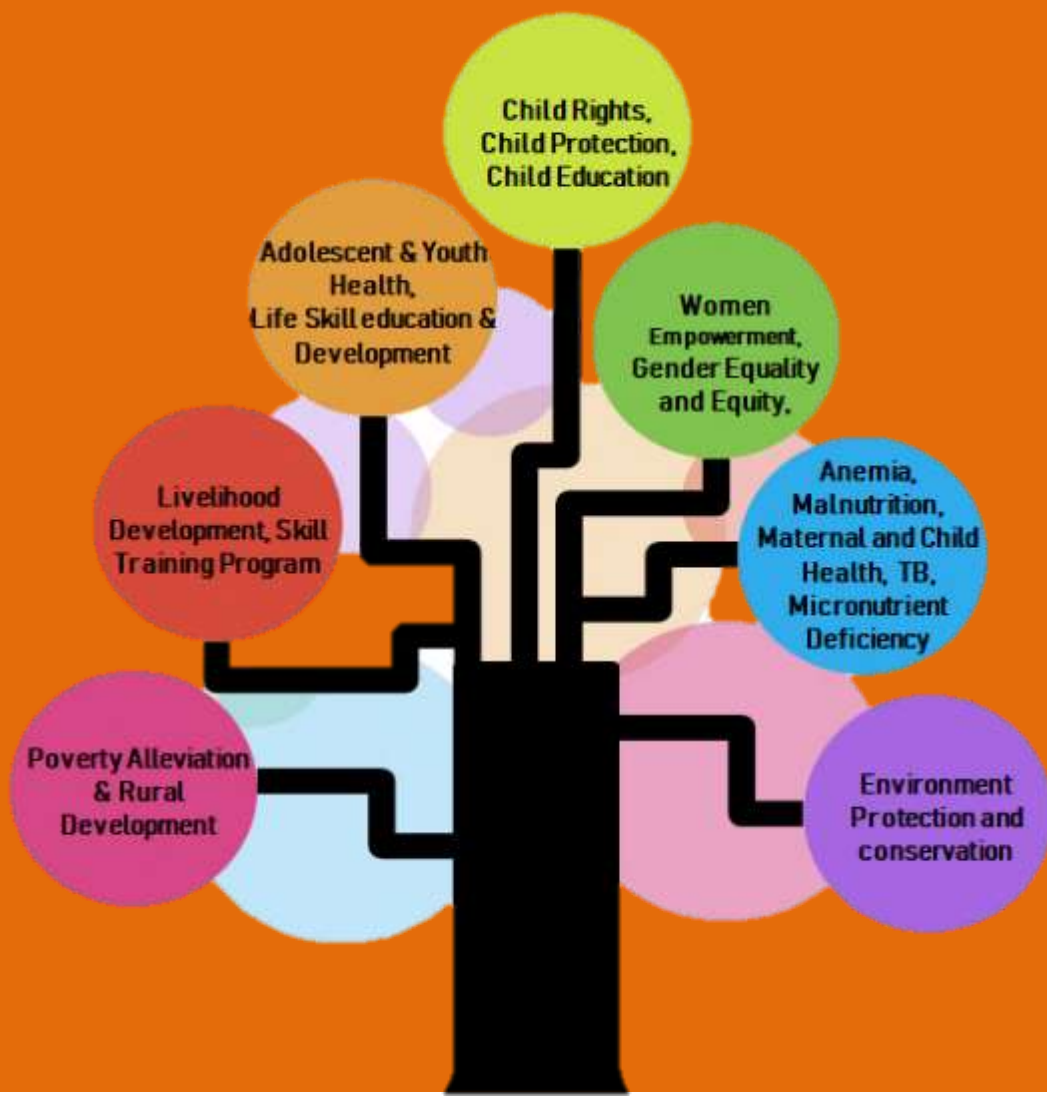

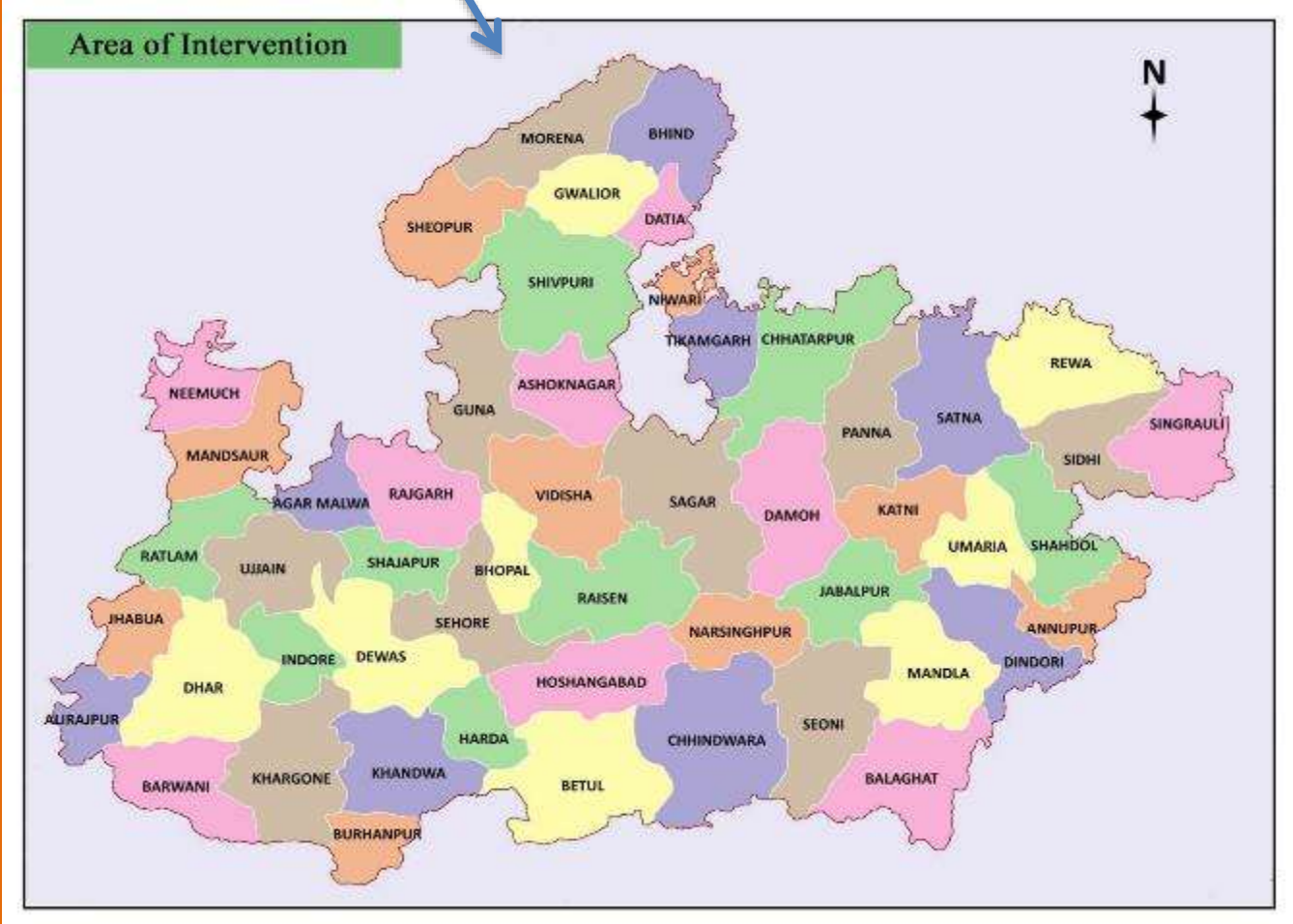

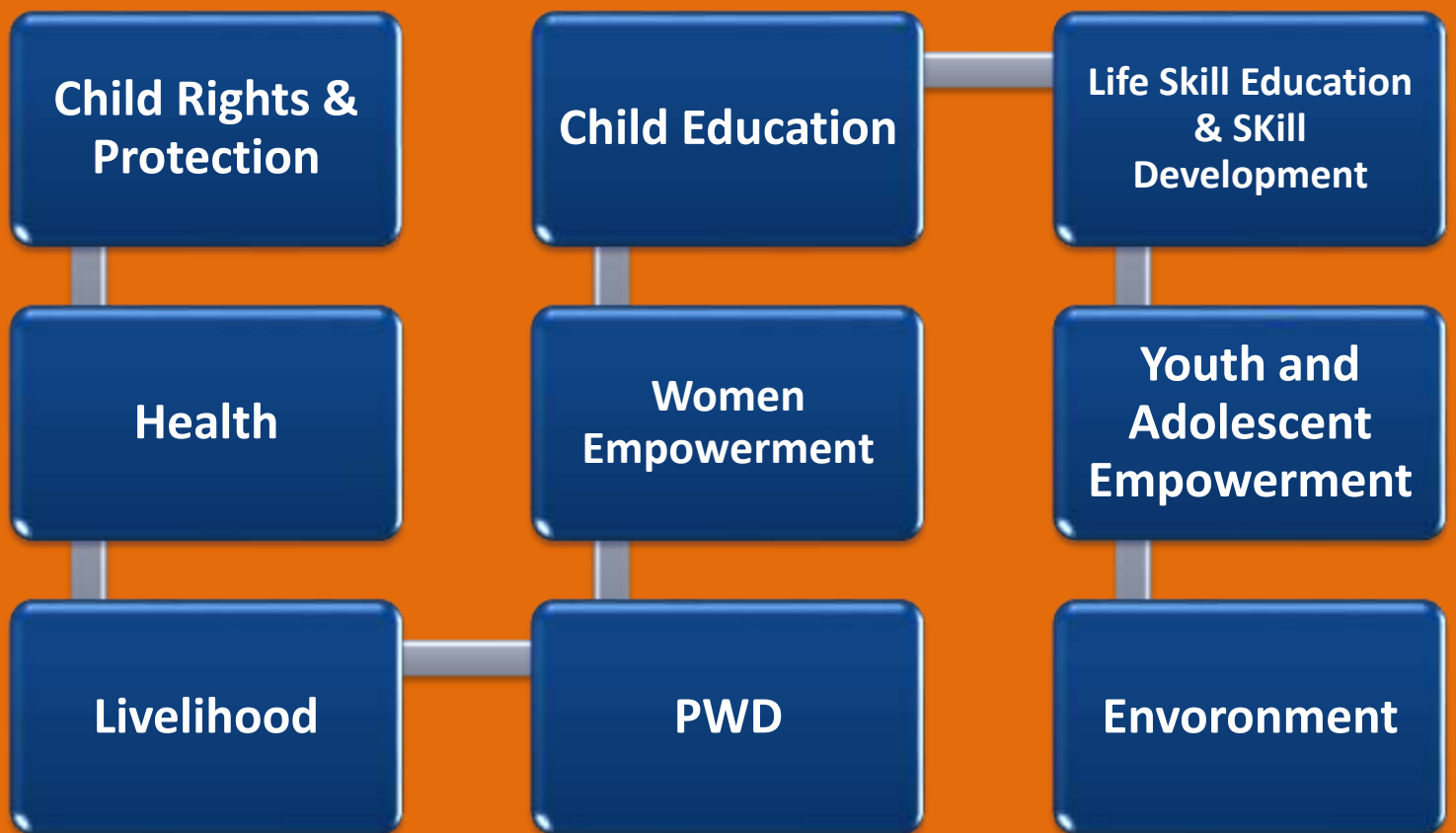

Area of Interventions



Child Rights & Protection-

Centre for integrated development believes that every child have individual entity and have same right in this society as adult have, for that CID work for ensure their rights at grass root level. For awareness generation CID undertake Rallies, Workshops and Seminar with Children, Youth & parents for implanting their basic rights i.e. right to participation, right to development, right to survival & right to protection. For Child education and protection CID Runs 4 projects multi sectoral approach to eradicate child labour, Child Line- 1098, Child Help Desk Railway Station and National Child Labour Project in Gwalior.

Health –

Madhya Pradesh has been identified by the National Health Mission as a high focus state and the condition of health is very poor. Centre for Integrated Development works on Anaemia, Malnutrition, Adolescents Health, Vitamin Deficiency, Community Based Maternal and Child Health, Tuberculosis & Sexual Health in 51 districts of Madhya Pradesh for improve health in villages level.

Women Empowerment-

Women's Empowerment is the process of empowering women. Empowerment can be defined in many ways. Empowering women means accepting and allowing women who are on the outside of the decision making process into it. Women's empowerment is the most crucial point to be noted for overall development of a country. For women empowerment CID support women through SHG's, skill trainings and linkage with government schemes.

Life skill Education & Skill Development-

Skills development is the process of identifying your skill gaps and developing and honing these skills. It is important because your skills determine your ability to execute your plans with success. Skill development is the continuous process so Centre for Intergrated development runs so many programmes like Computer education centre, stitching programme, course of beauty parlours for Youth, Adolescents & Women.

CID is working for making better Childhood:

Centre for Integrated Development is working for the child development from last 28 years, In Gwalior District there are approx. 20-25 thousand child labours, most of them are working in various occupation and industries like Carpet, Stone Crushers, Bidi, Brick kilns, Automobiles, Hotel-Dhaba, Domestic help and Rag-picking etc. There is decline in Child labour number due to awareness in public, RTE, NGOs and community efforts and government schemes like scholarships to backwards and minority communities, Out of the total mentioned child labour population, 55% are Girl Child labors. Since the inception of CID, we focused on multi-dimensional development of child so that they can easily come out from labour practices and understand their rights. This is the responsibility of society to insure rights of children to preserve their childhood. There are basic rights of the children were defined as Right to live, rights to development, Rights to participation and Rights to protection. CID focused on the determinants of these rights to fulfill the wholesome requirement of child rights.

Education:

CID had long experience of imparting education through innovative and interesting manner, which helped us in bringing children from deprived communities like Child labour, street children, Girls and children from slums to our centers and integrated them in formal school. CID had trained experienced team of Teachers / Education-Facilitators and Supervisors to initiate education programs.

Livelihood-

A sustainable livelihood is a basic need for having quality and dignified life for anyone. This is the core objective of the poverty alleviations programmes. For ensuring sustainable livelihood for deprived section in our interventions area CID give emphases on entrepreneurship development, skill development, SHC and inclusive self-help groups formation, Linking government income generation and self-employment programme, easy access to credit support, linking with financial institution, market linkages etc.

CID formed 63 ISHG having 662 members these all ISHG have benn linked government livelihood promotion programmes. Women associated with these SHG have been started income generation activates such as poultry, agriculture activities, dairy, Goatry, Bromm stick making, women jewellery shop, grocery shop etc. CID also organized skill development programme for sewing clothes, beauty parlour, mobile repairing etc. Demonstration unit for live demonstration established for goatry, kitchen garden and poultry.

Child Participation-

Children's participation includes the opportunity for children to express their point of view and opinions and thus to influence decision which may affect their lives. Participation includes different kinds of involvement, contribution, assistance and codetermination. CID formed children groups and gave children opportunity to vote for their presidents and they have some action plan for every year.

Community Mobilization:

CID mobilizes community through organizing the leadership potentials into like-minded groups. CID has been instrumental in organizing 65 SHGs with more than 700 women members, 125 child clubs (Bal Panchayat) consisting of above 1300 children, 155 Community groups having 3500 active community members, 45 women groups having 650 members.

Imparting knowledge and information leading to adequate behavioural and attitudinal changes:

CID imparts knowledge and information through trainings, orientations, meetings, and IPC and resource material development. CID imparts trainings to service providers such as ANM, ASHA, ASHA Sahyogani, Aganwadi workers and Assistant Aganwadi workers.

Working relationships with service providers:

Through regular communication, meetings, orientations and trainings CID has developed good working relationship with frontline service providers such as Aaganwadi workers, Assistant Aaganwadi workers, Teachers, ASHA, ASHA Sahyogani, ANM, MPW and Panchayat functionaries, considering the crucial role they play in the implementation of development schemes and projects.

Work with community group and Government:

CID believes that strengthening of community groups such as SMCs at school level, Mother committee at Aaganwadi level, VHSC at Panchayat level etc increases community participation providing impetus to government institutions and schemes to achieve the desired impact. CID mobilizes these groups through way of orientation and trainings program, education them of their roles and responsibilities.

People with Disability & Inclusive Development-

Inclusive development is core value of CID which includes all sections of society in developmental processes. CID tries to include and ensure participation of persons with disability in its all initiatives. CID is working with 662 persons with disability of Ghatigaon block for their rehabilitation by providing them health care, link them with government schemes, facilitate them to start income generation activities, ensure education to Children with special need (CWSN) formation of Inclusive Self-help group and Disability Peoples organizations etc.

MULTI SECTORAL APPROACH FOR ERADICATE CHILD LABOR

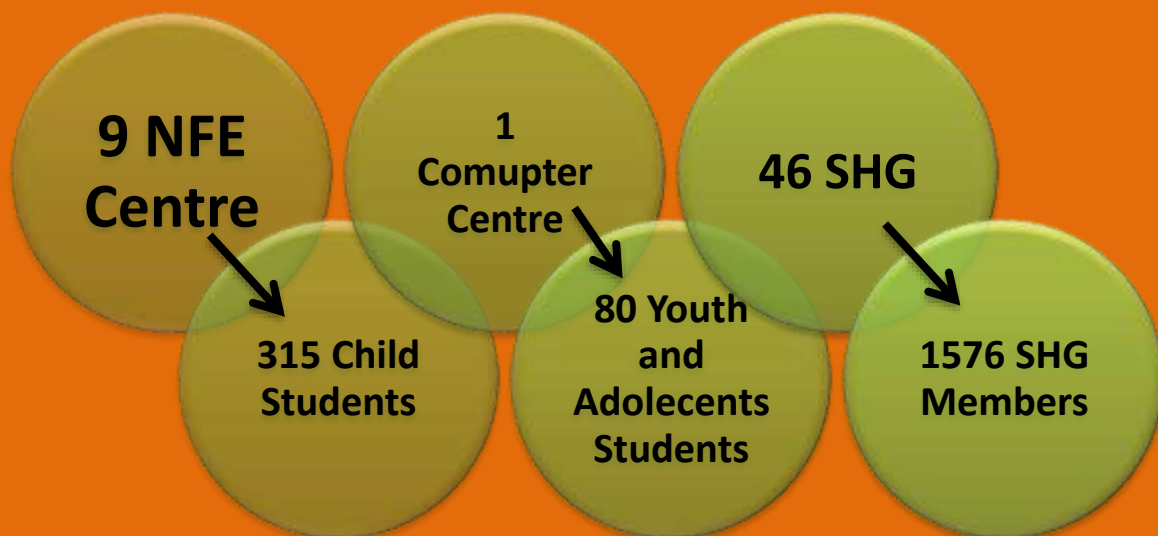
Child labour is a stigma on Indian society many government programs are being roll out to address this issue. But these efforts are not adequate until society and civil society will not participate in its full swing. With having this view, CID committed to mitigate child labour in Gwalior district. Child labour detains development of children.

Community served: This project is basically served each and every community including the families from migrated labour section and Minority (Muslim) community which is found more in number in the affected area.

Intervention Area- Rural and Urban slums of Gwalior District.

Objectives:

Eradication of Child labour by removing them from their workplace and providing support in area of education, health, better upbringing and developing better environment through community empowerment, awareness building and advocacy efforts”



Child is the heart of the CID. CID gave them opportunity to express their views and idea in front of every one. Along with education CID organized regular activities for development and participation of Children like Rally, Bal Mela, Children Convention, Workshops to improve children participation and Development of children.

Child Photography- On the 30th anniversary of UNCRC programme TDH announced a photography competition and they gave 4 topic for the photography's were- Child Marriage, Child labour, Child Education and Migration. Children of Our NFE centre choose Child

labour for photography. In 30 days our child and youth did tremendous work, all the photographs clicked by our child were presented at Geneva. Our child selected for the next round and TDH gave us support in child exhibition.



UNCRC Photo Exhibition-

Following different workshops on understanding of children rights, UNCRC and technique of photography, a group of youth leaders (around 15) trained around 100 children in their areas – villages, slums, and so on. Children and youth decided together to capture photographs on issues (primarily) Child Labour, Child Marriage and Drop-outs.

Initially around 600 photographs were received from the Child Reporters. Out of 600, 120 photographs were selected as per the technical standards and shared with HQ for exhibition in Geneva. Finally, 50 photographs were selected for Exhibition in Kolkata and release of Photo Book. The entire selection process has been coordinated by consultant photographer and a group of youth leaders. Photo Exhibition was organised at GWALIOR inaugurated by Mr. Pradyuman Singh Tomer (Cabinet Minister) on 26th and 27 December 2019 at Kala Vithika, Padav, Gwalior. This is a centrally located place where different types of exhibitions and programs are organized. Objective for organising the exhibition here was to attract common people, youths and schools children on the different issues of children like School drop outs child labour, child marriage etc.



Bal Panchayat Convention-

Centre for integrated development believes that all the children have the same rights as adult have. For empower child CID doing various programme. The convention is the most

imported programme organized by the CID on every year. The main purpose behind this programme is to empower child and develops their own brain for decision making.

This convocation were organized at “**kshetriya Gramin Vikas Prashikshan Kendra Gwalior**” During this programme the member of baal panchayat committee were present their last year work in front of 300 children from different different community. As this



panchayat work for society and they fixed some task for one year and the whole team including president of baal panchayat to member of baal panchayat worked together for betterment of the society. CID play a back side role in this process. In 2019-2020 year convention all the report were presented and new member were elected by the children itself.

BAL UTSAV – 2019

Centre for Integrated Development celebrated Bal Utsav on 7th December 2019 at Bal Bhavan, City Centre, Gwalior.

In this event more than 232 children, 22 staff members inclusive of interns and volunteers were participated,. The children came from all the 9 centres run with the support of TDH-Suisse- Awadpura, Maadre Ki Mata, Transport Nagar, Kishanbagh, Noorgunj, Khajaanchi baba, Subhash nagar, Shankarpur, Nakhtapata. The motive behind this programme is to engage children in extracurricular activity and an orientation on child rights.



The total numbers of children presence were divided into 7 groups which one by one went to each Corner. The time slot given for children to be in one corner was 20 minutes each. The names of the seven groups were More, Chiriya, Kabuter, Tota, Hans, Koyal and Maina.

The whole aim of the event is to let the children learn various things in a fun way. 7 corners were set up in the fete, namely:

1. Child Rights Section- the section talked about child rights
2. Kabaad se Jugaad- Children in this corner were taught how to use waste material to make fancy items like paper rose, hanging lamps, stick painting, sunflower with tea leaves, etc.
3. Puppet Show- this corner displayed a puppet show that educated people about their rights, created awareness about child labour and how to save our environment.
4. Origami Section- In this corner children were talk to make 5 different types of caps.
5. Maatha Pachhee Section- this corner was set up to judge the knowledge of children like showing pictures of trees and asking which fruit it bears, names of vegetables in English, different shapes in hindi ,etc.
6. Games- in this section there were many games like 'who skips more', aim the ring and football.
7. Competition- Drawing and Painting competition were held on different topics like- Importance of Education, Environment, Child Labour.



Celebration of Child Day-

Centre for Integrated Development (CID) celebrated child day and organized so many different programmes in Gwalior city like Rally, Nukkad Natak, Video Play, Different kind of competitions like painting, drawing, drama.



Youth and Adolescent Orientation- CID organized two youth and adolescent orientation on the topic of gender equality, environment, participation, and citizenship. The main objective of these orientations is to enhance understanding on gender; environment and participation so youth can take own decision and support us to give their efforts for betterment of society.

Youth and Adolescent Workshops- CID organized 5 workshops on communication and participation with 114 participants. The objective of these workshops is to improve knowledge on participation & how participate in every single decision and improve communication and express their views in front of everyone

To roll out of Vitamin A, WIFA and MIFA Programs in 6 District of Madhya Pradesh (Nutritive International)

Centre for Integrated Development (CID), in partnership with NI is playing a vital role for implementing the various nutrition oriented program. Team CID works to implement Vitamin A program, reduce anaemia among adolescent age especially girls, pregnant and lactating women in the selected district of Gwalior and Chambal Division. We work in close association with the District Administration of Health, ICDS, Education and Tribal welfare departments at the divisional/district/block levels to ensure effective and timely implementation of the programme. The project aims to increase the coverage and consumption of IFA tablets and behavioural changes like dietary practices among adolescent girls in the state. The programme phase was between May 2019 to Mar 2020.

Key Objective:-

CID is in partnership with NI is providing support to the state government to execute WIFA, MIFA and VAS programme to reach the following goals:

- Report no stock-outs of WIFA each month in at least 80% of the VHND sessions, schools and AWCs.
- Improve coverage and increase consumption of at least 24 IFA tablets among adolescents by 25% in 2019-2020.
- 95% of schools and 85% AWCs regularly submit WIFA monthly coverage report
- increase in the consumption of 90+ IFA by 25% in 2019-2020.
- 20% increase in the consumption of 180+ tablets of calcium by 2020.
- Data validation shows significant improvement in quality of reported data.
- Strengthening of quality of reported data in HMIS for MIFA and its regular review by CMHO.

CHILDLINE INDIA FOUNDATION

CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF) is the nodal agency of the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development acting as the parent organisation for setting up, managing and monitoring the CHILDLINE 1098 service all over the country. CIF is the sole agency/body responsible for establishing the CHILDLINE service across the country, monitoring of service delivery and finance, training, research and documentation, creating awareness, advocacy as well as resource generation for the service. CHILDLINE 1098 is a phone number that spells hope for millions of children across India. It is a 24-hour a day, 365 days a year, free, emergency phone service for children in need of aid and assistance. We not only respond to the emergency needs of children but also link them to relevant services for their long-term care and rehabilitation. We have, till date, connected to three million children across the nation offering them care and protection.

Intervention Area- Gwalior City

Objective:

- ❖ Ensure that every child who is vulnerable, neglected, marginalized and/or abused or exploited has access to the emergency helpline phone assisted of CHILDLINE through a nationally recognized telephone number i.e. 1098.
- ❖ Provide a platform of networking amongst organizations and to provide linkages to support systems, which facilitate the rehabilitation of children in difficult circumstances.
- ❖ Work towards an active partnership with allied systems (such as the police, health, transport, education and such others) to protect the rights of children.
- ❖ Build up a referral network of experts from the legal, medical, media, education and other relevant professions in each city to take up issues related to the ChildLine need of care and protection.



CHILD-HELP DESK / RAILWAY CHILD LINE

Child help desk is a joint initiative of Ministries of Women & Child Development and Railways. The largest number of homeless children, pavement dwellers, street and working children, child substance abusers and child beggars left on their own and in need of care and support reside in urban areas. These children suffer extreme deprivation compounded by lack of shelter and access to basic services for survival. Many of them travel from small towns and rural areas to urban areas, alone or with families, in search of livelihood, or hope for a better life, or in anger, or on impulse. A large number of children who run away from their homes use railways as a mode to travel. There are also children who are trafficked and transported through railways. Finally, a number of children get separated from their guardians during the course of their journey through railway. Such children are vulnerable to the harsh reality of street life and are often victims of various forms of abuse; physical, sexual, emotional as well as economic exploitation. They often end up living on their own in streets, market places and especially at railway stations. All these places are transit points for trafficking and need focussed programmes and attention for rescue and rehabilitation. The Ministry of Women and Child Development and Ministry of Railways have jointly taken an initiative to ensure the care and protection, security and well-being of run-away, unaccompanied and trafficked children who come in contact with the railways. Our team of Railway help desk is working 24*7 for help of needy children.

Reduction of Malnutrition & Anemia in Madhya Pradesh

CID and WJCF enter into this Agreement to complete objectives related to public sector work in Reducing Malnutrition and Anaemia in 13 districts of Madhya Pradesh state, namely, Gwalior, Bhind, Morena, Sheopur, Shivpuri, Datia, Guna, Ashoknagar, Shahjapur, Agar, Rajgarh, Vidisha, Raisen.

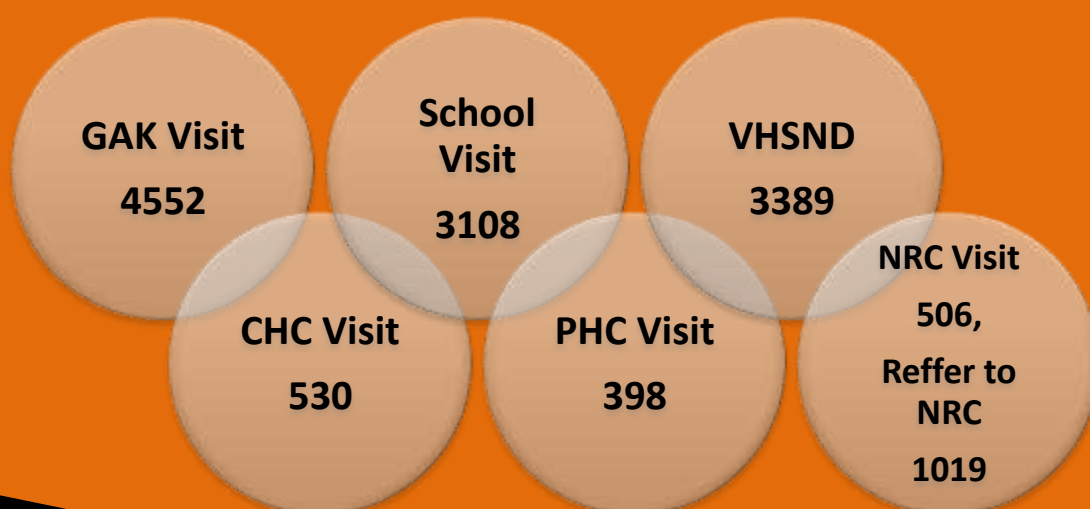
Project Gaol- CHAI's Nutrition Initiative for MP aims to break the inter-generational vicious cycle of malnutrition. The goal of this project is to reduce the proportion of both anaemic adolescent girls and pregnant women by 10 percentage points (from current status of 57% and 60% for adolescent girls and pregnant women, respectively) and to reduce the proportion of underweight and stunted children by 10 percentage points by 2019.

PROJECT STRATEGY-

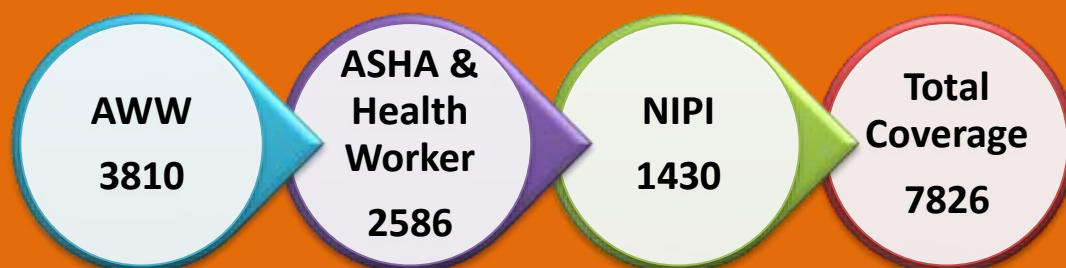
CID in partnership with CHAI aims to work with ICDS and Health Department, through NGO partners to improve knowledge, skill and attitude of large network of Front line workers. NGO partners will carry out the implementation strategy of reaching out to AWWs, ASHAs, Teachers and Caregivers through various platforms/activities. The strategy includes the following aspects to reduce the burden to anaemia and malnutrition in Madhya Pradesh

- Improve the intake of iron folic acid (IFA) supplement by adolescent girls & pregnant women
- Build the capacity of front-line workers to effectively manage ICDS support
- Improve hygiene and sanitation conditions in areas with high burden of malnutrition

Program Name- National Child Labor Project (NCLP)

National Child Labor Project (NCLP) is a central government scheme launched for the children under this project are withdrawn from hazardous occupations and then put into special schools in order to get mainstreamed into formal schooling system. These special schools were formed in order to enable them to get mainstreamed into formal schooling system. These special schools provide non formal/ bridge education, skilled/vocational training, mid-day meals, stipend @ rupees 450/month and health care facilities. This year we were able to mainstream 22 children into class five, out of which there were 12 boys and 10 girls. These children were withdrawn from labor activities like carpet weaving and carpentry. We also conducted five rallies in different parts of the city on generating mass awareness about prohibition of child labor.

Project location-: CID is running a Child labour Education and Rehabilitation Centre for the children in carpet weaving Situated at Awadpura (Gwalior).

Target Group and activities-: The child workers identified in the survey are put in the special schools and provided the following facilities:

- a) Non-formal/formal education
- b) Skilled/craft training
- c) Supplementary nutrition.
- d) Stipend
- e) Health care facilities through a doctor every month.



SAMARTH – Community Based Inclusive

Persons with Disabilities and their family have equal access to health, education, economic, social, political and entitlements through comprehensive community based rehabilitation and development programme. CID is working in two directions to ensure accessibility of persons with disability and their family members. Firstly CID generated awareness among community and persons with disability about their rights, entitlements and government services. CID focused on capacity building of DPO leaders, ISHG members and other community members so they can become capable to avail their rights by their own. On other hand CID sensitized service provider and office bearers on issues pertaining to Persons with disability and their community and try to build up coordination and networking. These efforts brought positive results, this year Health service provider recognized medical treatment needs of 233 community people (120 persons with disability) for availing medical services. 168 persons with disability improved their mobility and communication after receiving required assistive devices. After availing medical care 936 community-members (454 persons with disability) are now able to live qualitative life with their community. Parents of Children Special Needs sensitized regarding importance of education in Children life later on 51 Children with special need (28 boys + 23 girls) got admission in schools and have accessed to education at their village school. Through project efforts 71 persons with disability and 79 communities are now have regular and adequate income. DPOs leaders made efforts to solve issues of persons with disability and other community members. For this they submitted 114 applications at public hearing at collector office of Gwalior.

Family Planning & Sexual Reproductive Health:

Over View of the project-

Family planning and sexual reproductive health basically two aspects of society. In Madhya Pradesh the fertility rate is 2.8. In MP population rate is increasing by each passing day, especially in tribal areas and small villages. In every year 45000 (estimate) women die in India due to complications of pregnancy and child-birth, that means 174 maternal deaths per 100000 live births. In India people having Lack knowledge about contraceptives (temporary and permanent). Only 49% of married use a modern methods of contraceptives and 13% of married women have an unmet need for family planning. Now a days high rates of unwanted pregnancy and unsafe abortion.

In Madhya Pradesh unsafe abortions are still common. Adolescents and women bear a disproportionately high burden of both unsafe abortion and unwanted pregnancies. Married adolescents in India have a particularly high unmet overall contraceptives need i.e. 22%. In one of the top five largest states in India by population- Madhya Pradesh – only 7.5% of currently married adolescents use modern contraceptives.

Despite very liberal legal and policy ground for the provision of safe abortion, unsafe abortions are still common. The number of certified abortion providers and facilities is inadequate, resulting in limited availability of quality services, especially in rural areas and in the less development states. In addition there is limited knowledge and awareness around the legal provisions for abortion and availability of services both among client and health care providers.

This project is working on 2 most important objectives-

- 1st Increase access to safe abortion and post abortion care
- 2nd increase the access to and uptake highly effective methods of contraception.

Strategies-

1st supply chain strengthening- ensure the stock and availability of abortions, family planning commodities and equipment's at facility through the forecasting and supply planning across the 25 district of Madhya Pradesh

2nd Capacity Building- across MP, Improve supply chain personnel capacity to operate and adhere to monitoring information system protocol related to SRH. In four focus district or Madhya Pradesh, increase the capacity of health care workers to deliverable related to family planning and safe abortion including counselling and follow up care.

3rd community Engagement- To create awareness and knowledge about the legality and safe abortion & post abortion care and use of highly effective method of contraception.

4th Systems Strengthening- provide the technical assistance to the reproductive health and family planning program across the state to create enabling environment of SRH service provision.

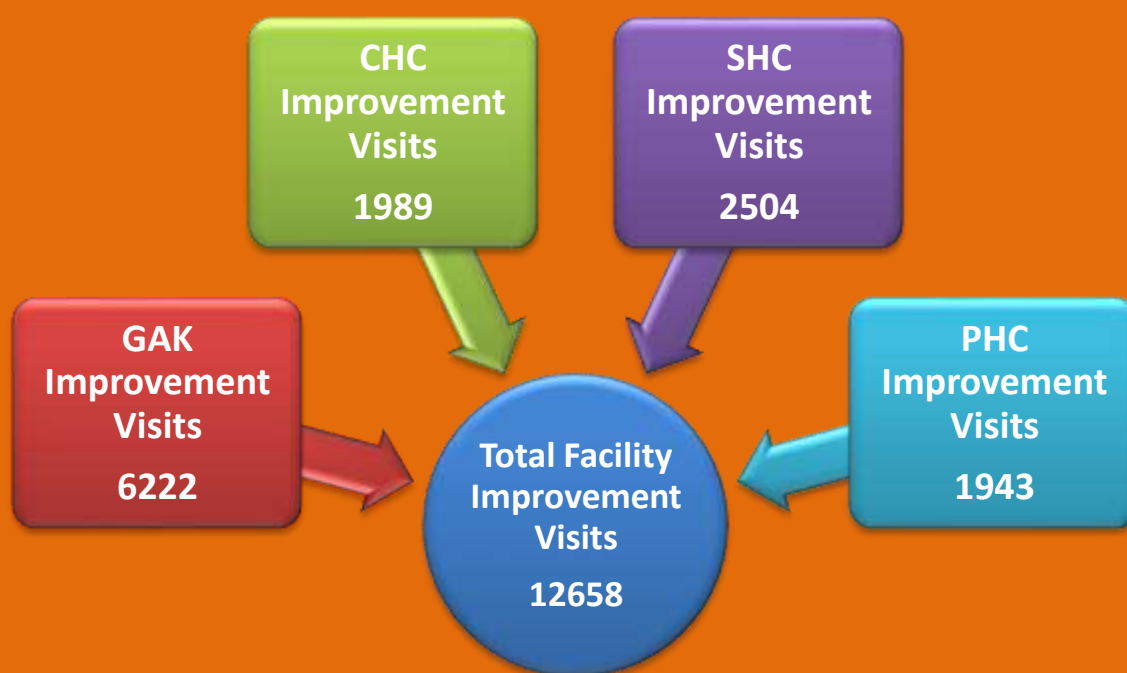
Where We Work-

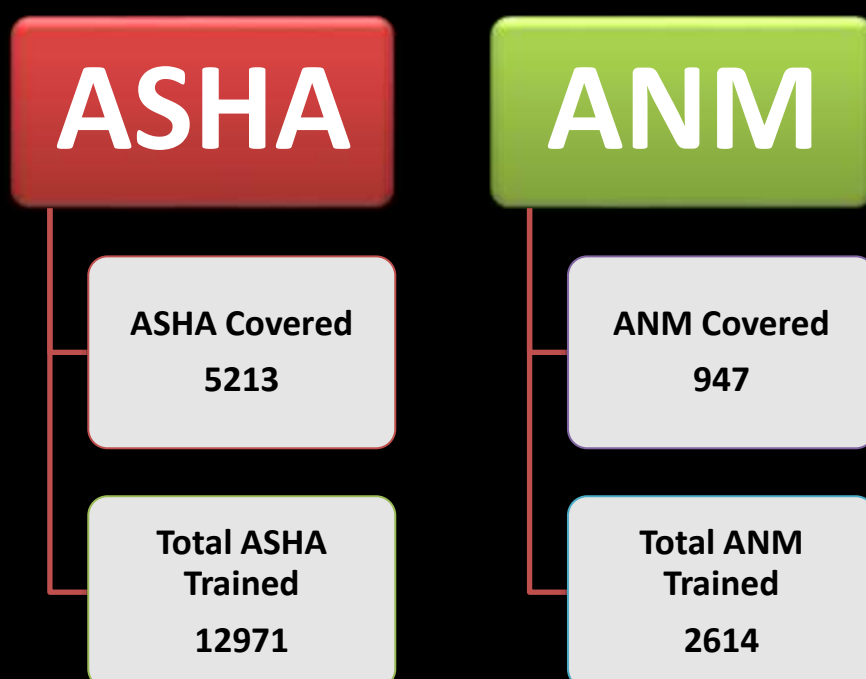
What We Cover

AIR POLLUTION SHORTENING LIVES OF CITIZENS IN GWALIOR

EPIC India, Center for Integrated Development workshop discusses impact of air pollution on residents in the city and state

Being one of the non-attainment cities with respect to ambient air quality under the national clean air programme, Gwalior deterioration of air quality had been a cause of national concern. According to the Energy Policy Institute at the University of Chicago's Air Quality Life Index (AQLI), residents of Gwalior, could live about 6.1 years longer if World Health Organization (WHO) guidelines were met. Way back in 1998, the gain in life expectancy by meeting the same air quality standards was 3.3 years. These, along with other insightful details, were shared in a workshop organized by the Center for Integrated Development and the Energy Policy Institute at the University of Chicago (EPIC India) in Gwalior's Jiwaji University on 23rd November 2019. The workshop, meant to raise awareness about the impact of pollution on human health, was attended by more than 60 participants, consisting of environment science students from the Department of Environment Science, Jiwaji University, faculty members, representatives from local NGOs & journalists.



Training of SHG members on group functioning and financial management

Annual Learning & Review Meeting at Panchmarhi

Centre for integrated development organized 3 days review meeting of CID staff at Panchmarhi MP. The purpose behind this meeting is to annual review of work done by the staff in last year & action plan for the upcoming year. Around 150 staff of centre for integrated development were attended this meeting. In 3 days meeting of days our top level management evaluate their last year work and gave them apperception those were performed well.



Camp for case finding of Tuberculosis patients

CID organized 11 health camps with help of health department in urban slum area for identification of TB patients having coughed more than two weeks. General medicines also provided to patients like cold cough fever, skin diseases, headache etc. Hence more 1200 individuals from marginalised community got medical care free of cost. 150 sputum sample of tb suspected were send to District tuberculosis centre for microscopy. Among them 12 patients have been identified.

In this year CID identified 32 TB patients through active case finding with help of health department and National tuberculosis elimination programme staff. CID ensure that patient adhere to treatment under DOTs throughout their treatment course so they cannot become defaulter. CID also helps patients to link with national poshan yojana under which patients got 500/- rupees per month for having nutritional food.
