About Centre for Integrated Development

The Centre for Integrated Development (CID) is the brainchild of a group of socially committed philanthropists who came together in 1992 to make a small but important effort that could make a difference in the lives of society's marginalized and excluded people. CID began its operations in Madhya Pradesh's northern region. Madhya Pradesh is known for its backwardness, starving deaths, feudalism, and malpractices, all of which contribute to the state's underdevelopment. In the midst of such poor conditions, there is a ray of optimism as CID continues to work in rural areas of the region to voice the concerns of the most vulnerable members of society. CID has worked on numerous disadvantaged groups of society throughout the span of its 30-year journey, including health, women, children, PWDs, and tribal communities. Multi-dimensional development and promotion of child rights and education for children and abolition of child labor, community health, community development, rural development, gender equality, equity, and poverty reduction through livelihoods and skill development are just a few of our core areas. In Madhya Pradesh, CID works on crucial issues such as hunger, anemia, pneumonia, vitamin deficiency, family planning and sexual reproductive health.

Food Support-

Dry ration packs were supplied to **750** members of the Ghatigaon block in the Gwalior district. The majority of them are from disadvantaged communities such as tribal and ST, SC communities, people with disabilities, and destitute women, men, and children. Beneficiaries were chosen after consultation with OPD and ISHG members. After receiving a Dry ration box, our community members were extremely grateful to CBM. The quality of the food materials was likewise excellent. Members of the OPD and ISHG thanked CBM for assisting their community during this critical time.

The organization provided food kits to **214** families with the support of JIV DAYA FOUNDATION among them **172** belongs to the Sahariya tribe and other families belong to other vulnerable sections (such as minority, Schedule caste, and other backward castes). **128** foods Kit provided to families those head or other member is facing severe kind of disability. **26** widow and migrant families were provided food Kit. All these families are very grated full to JIV DAYA FOUNDATION and CID because they did not have such qualitative food ever even in normal time.



Mask Distribution

During Covid-19, Centre for Integrated Development distributed around **100000** mask to children, adults, Youth and Community Member to protect them from Corona Virus.



Livelihood Support

Firstly, we have identified 30 Persons with disability in project area. With support of CBM these 30 persons with disability got Rs. 25000 for their livelihood. All the beneficiaries were persons with disability in which 11 are women with disabilities. All the beneficiary are doing their self-employment such as goat farming, buffalo farming, agriculture farming, carpet making, vegetable production, grocery shop etc. These beneficiaries are earning **8000** to **10000** thousand per month.

Firstly we have identified **100** needy Persons in project area. With support of TDH these **100** needy persons got Rs. 3000 for their livelihood and school fees support. All the beneficiary are doing their self-employment such as vegetable sellers, cloth sellers, carpet making, vegetable production, sewing machine and grocery shop etc. These beneficiaries are earning 5000 to 10000 thousand per month





Health Support

We have distributed **72** digital thermometers and thermal guns for ASHA, ANM and Anganwadi workers of the Ghatigaon block in Gwalior district. Project team members in about its uses. They were very thankful for CBM.

Hand washing and hygiene practices play very crucial role, COVID scenario proved it. With the support of TDH we distributed **799** Health kits for families of community who has pregnant women, person with disability and adolescent girl as a family member in **12** community areas (Pichhore, Naktapatha, Nurgang, Khajhanchi Baba, Kishanbagh, Transport Nager, Subhas Nagar, Madre Ki Mata, Aapagang, Nurgang, Bara, Indra Nager and Shankarpur). Health kits consisted 2 Masks, Hand sanitizer, Stayfree sanitary pad and soap in one packet. Our community members were very thankful to TDH after getting health kit.





Mobility Aid

Mobility Aid distribution program was organized for people who are physically disabled to improve their livelihood. JIV DAYA Foundation. It is very appreciable that JIV DAYA FOUNDATION is lending a helping hand to them. With the Support of JIV DAYA FOUNDATION, CID distributed 13 Tricycles to disabled people from 11 villages in Ghatigaon block. Chief Guest for the program was SDOP Mr. Praveen Asthana along with other Police personnel, Mr. Ashish Pandey from JIV DAYA FOUNDATION.



Support Education

435 children (F-254, M-181) have access basic quality education and 84 Youth & Children have completed their basic computer education. Apart from this **500** children of formal school (F-320, M-180) have got online and offline education support and provided notes, books and worksheets for needy children.



Community Awareness of COVID-19

CID has distributed **3500** templates through awareness programs and rallies and mass awareness was done and around **6000** people from the community were got to know about the issue of covid- 19, how to prevent coronavirus, and aware of the covid vaccination, because this is the basic tool to get off from this life killing virus.



VACCINATION

With support of cbm we took **150** people of ghatigaon block to barai panchayat and got them vaccinated, majority of the members where persons with disabilities. Vaccination was done from 25th to 27th september of 2021 at barai.

Organization has organized vaccination camp in awarpura, kishanbagh ,madre ki mata,transport nager,subhas nager and naktapatha community in which members of shg and community, parents and youth groups total of **465** have vaccinated first and second dose of covishield and covaxin



WASH & HYGIENE SUPPORT

Hand washing and hygiene practices are play very crucial role, Covid scenario proved it. With support of CBM we distributed 500 hygiene kits for families of community who has pregnant women, person with disability and adolescent girl as a family member. Hygiene kits consisted 5-N95 Masks, Hand sanitizer, little microbial wipes, Stayfree sanitary pad and Dettol soap in one packet. Our community members were very thankful of CBM after having Hygiene kit.

Organization has installed Hand Wash stations in Kishanbagh, Madre Ki Mata, Khajhanchi Baba and Pichhore communities. In which community members can wash their hands and motivate others to wash hands and maintain cleanness.

Key Achievements of the year

Child Education and Participation-

The program approach is based on the premise of Education-Protection-Participation. Established by the International Convention on the Rights of the Child as a fundamental right, education is a foundation to achieve sustainable development goals. Access to education for all must be ensured without discrimination. CID provides children and adults with the knowledge to build a more sustainable and united future, not forgetting that at school, children are better protected against the risks of forced marriages or exploitation. It supports teachers in the adoption of participative practices that respect children's rights.



In order to ensure the right to protection, the behavior of parents, teachers, authorities, but also of children, and young people themselves must change. CID raises awareness among adults and children about children's rights, including the right to protection. In order to fight against the worst forms of child labor, actions are focused on prevention and offering alternatives to the populations involved, as well as the promotion of education among child workers.

In order to enable children to participate as fully as possible in decisions that affect them, CID gives them the opportunity to participate by making them aware of their rights and providing them the tools to defend themselves, and by creating access to participation groups. Even the young people have been integrated into the governance of the association since the creation of the International Youth Council in 2018, supported by Terre des Hommes Suisse.



Child Protection & Care

Centre for integrated development believes that every child possesses an individual identity and have same right in this society as those of any adult, for that CID works to ensure their rights at grass root level. For awareness generation, CID undertake Rallies, Workshops and Seminar with Children, Youth & parents for implanting their basic rights i.e. right to participation, right to development, right to survival & right to protection. For Child education and protection CID Runs 4 projects multi sectoral approach to eradicate child labour, Child Line- 1098, Child Help Desk Railway Station and National Child Labour Project in Gwalior.



Adolescents & Youth Empowerment

Centre for Integrated Development working with children, youth and adolescents. More than 460 volunteers from adolescents and youth are doing activity work for the betterment of the society.



Digital Literacy

Skill development training- One community-based Computer Education Centre is being run by CID Which trained 184 children and youth on Computer literacy. Theoretical and practical sessions were organized on MS Office (Excel, Word, and Microsoft Power Point), Word Pad and Note Pad. Children have also learnt to draft letters and develop documents in Hindi as well in English. The duration of the course is 4 months.

CID is facilitating Computer Training Course to build basic skills on Computer Operations among children and youth of the community where this opportunity does not exist. After completion of the curriculum, CID organized an internal assessment for assessing knowledge level of the students.



Inclusive Development of Disability & Empowerment

Inclusive development is core value of CID which includes all sections of society in its developmental processes. CID tries to include and ensure participation of persons with disability in its all initiatives. CID is working with persons with disability of Ghatigaon block for their rehabilitation by providing them health care, linking them with government schemes, facilitating them to start income generation activities, and ensuring education to Children with special need (CWSN) formation of Inclusive Self-help group and Disability Peoples organizations etc.



Celebration of World Environment

Organization has celebrated world Environment Day in all 9 support education center(SEC) ,in which painting competition has organized and 25 boys (children and youth) and 85 girls have participated. By this way ,children and youth have sensitized community member thorough paintingabout harmful effect of environment. Apart from this ,Essay competition about harmful impact of environment has organized in Computer Center.



Health and Happiness

Madhya Pradesh has been identified by the National Health Mission as a state and the condition of health is very low health indicators. Centre for Integrated Development works on Anaemia, Malnutrition, Adolescents Health, Vitamin Deficiency, Community Based Maternal and Child Health, Tuberculosis & Sexual Health.





Save Environment

For saving environment Center for integrated development celebrated save environment week During Environment Protection week, our 71 youths and 150 children have participated as a volunteer and we have covered a total of **700** children, **650** youth, and **1600** adults.

To save the environment different types of activities likewise, such as Rally, Exhibitions, Drawing competitions, Seed ball making, Street Play, community awareness, and plantations had been done in the community.











Livelihood support

Firstly, we have identified 30 Persons with disability in the project area. With support of CBM these 30 persons with disability got Rs. **25000** for their livelihood. All the beneficiaries were persons with disability of which 11 are women with disabilities. All the beneficiary are doing their self-employment such as goat farming, buffalo farming, agriculture farming, carpet making, vegetable production, grocery shop etc. These beneficiaries are earning **8000** to **10000** thousand per month.





Income Generation

Total **351** Community people in which **162** (86 Male, 76 Female) persons with disabilities started income generation activities such as Tailoring, Grocery shop, Vegetable selling, Vegetable production, etc.





Medical care and referral service

425 community people which include **262** persons with disabilities were facilitated to availing medical treatment at Government and private facilities with the support of our team members.





Kadaknath poultry farming unit

A poultry (Kedaknath chicken) unit was established with help of Inclusive self-help group (ISHG) members. on date 25th January 2022 Honorable Chief minister Sh. Shivraj Singh Chauhan visited there.







Farmer's producer organization (FPO)

One Farmers producer organization (FPO) has been registered in the company registration act. The name of FPO is Sashakt Aajeevika goat farmers producer company ltd. The FPO consists of 10 Board of Directors and all are women which including 3 women with disabilities and 7 disabled family members. FPO consists of **300** Goat farmers as members. The bank account of FPO has been opened in the Central bank of India, Barai branch in Ghatigaon block of Gwalior (Madhya Pradesh).

The community members which include persons with disabilities are mobilized into 21 OPDs (Organization of persons with disabilities) (128 Male and 70 Female), 110 ISHGs (Inclusive self-help group) (64 Male and 980 Female) members, 1 Block level OPD, and 1 FPO.





Goat Breeding Centre

The goat breeding center has been established on 5500 sqft. area and 18 jamunapari breed goats have been purchased from Chack Nagar Etawah district of Uttar Pradesh. This unit has been constructed section-wise for small goats and big ones and male goats.

15 trainings were conducted with help of RSETI (RURAL SELF EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING INSTITUTE) from April 2021 to March 2022. In this training **310** goat farmers (Tribal and Backward communities) participated from surrounding villages. Though This Centre Goat farmers also got Medical and technical services for goat farming. We are planning to develop it as a training and marketing center so that goat farmers got good prices for their goats.







Distribution of hygiene kits

Hand washing and hygiene practices play very crucial role, Covid scenario proved it. With support of CBM we distributed **1000** hygiene kits for families of community who has pregnant women, person with disability and adolescent girl as a family member. Hygiene kits consisted 5 N95 Masks, Hand sanitizer, little microbial wipes, Stayfree sanitary pad and dettol soap in one packet. Our community members were very thankful of CBM after having Hygiene kit



Wash & Hygiene Support

Organization has installed Hand Wash stations in Kishanbagh, Madre Ki Mata, Khajhanchi Baba and Pichhore communities. In which community members can wash their hands and motivate others to wash hands and maintain cleanness.
