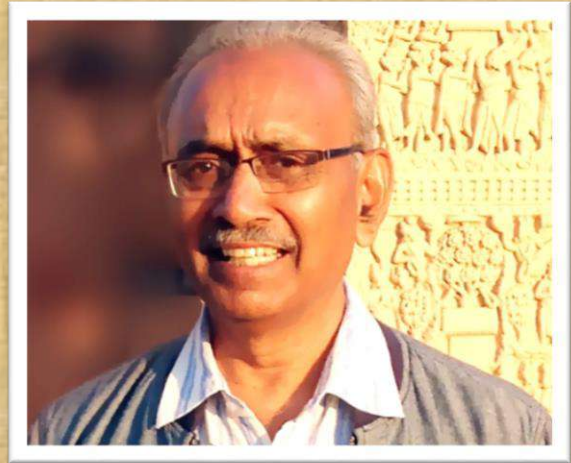

# Child Rights & Child Education





Centre for Integrated Development is working on the promotion and protection of child rights since its inception. CID has ignited a torch of child rights and carrying it with exuberance and pride in Gwalior. In this reporting year we have organized many activities to promote and protect child rights.

## NFE Centers

Centre for Integrated Development runs ten Non Formal Education Centers in the city where child labors are being provided primary education. The motive of running NFE centers is to bridge the gap occurred during years of their laborhood in these children before enrolling to the formal schools.

340 children have partially or fully removed from work and getting non formal education at our centers while 125 school going children was provided supported education by CID.

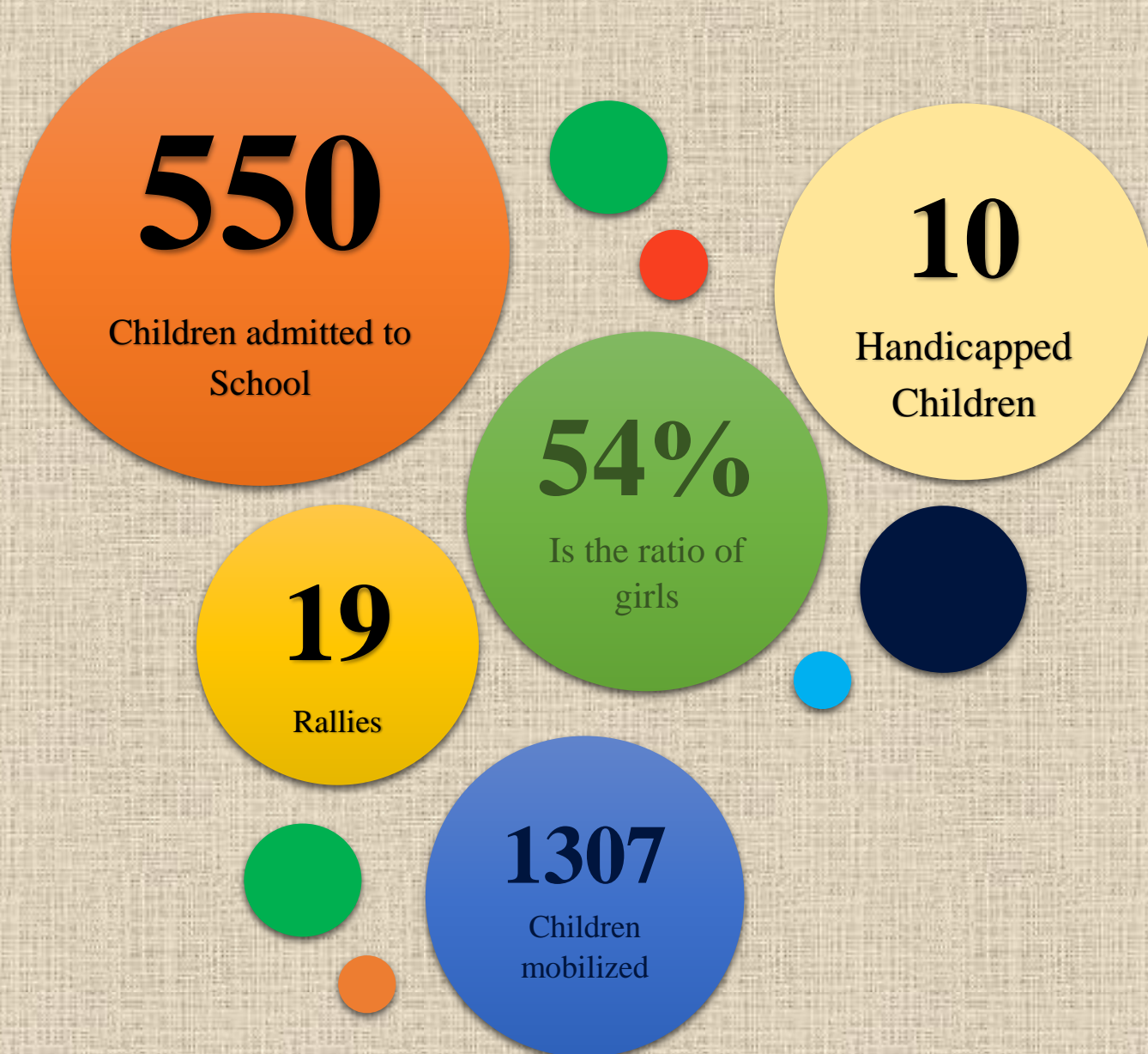

# Anemia

Anemia, iron deficiency is very prevalent in India. Anemia is the root of most of health issue Indian women face in her life. It can be consider a quiet assassin of health. One in every two Indian women (56%) suffers from some form of anemia. This deficiency can be life threatening if neglected, among Indian women it is being neglected. Anemia is the root cause of high maternal mortality rate, low weight of children at birth, and high risk and complication during pregnancy and many more health issues, especially among women. Centre for Integrated Development is doing an extensive work on Anemia. CID has partnered with CHAI (Clinton Health Access Initiative), NI (Nutrition International) and Tata trust to work on the issue of Anemia in Madhya Pradesh. 68 Blocks in 13 Districts has been covered. We are working with community, changer makers and government to address the issue of anemia.

Activities such as District level orientations of stakeholders, Block level Orientation stakeholders, Monitoring, Capacity Building, Liaising with the various department of the government, advocacy, Organizing Bal Sabha in Schools, Assisting government in executing program and campaign are being done to address the issue

## FLW Training

Front Line Workers such as ASHA, ANM, Anganwadi workers are the backbone of any government run initiative. Solidification of the FLW is vital for the attainment of the driver. Centre for Integrated Development has organized trainings for FLWs on various aspects of anemia preclusion and its remedy.



# Orientations and Trainings of Officials

District and Block level officials of departments such as Health, ICDS, Agriculture, and Administration should also be oriented and trained for the better execution of the programs to address the issue of anemia.

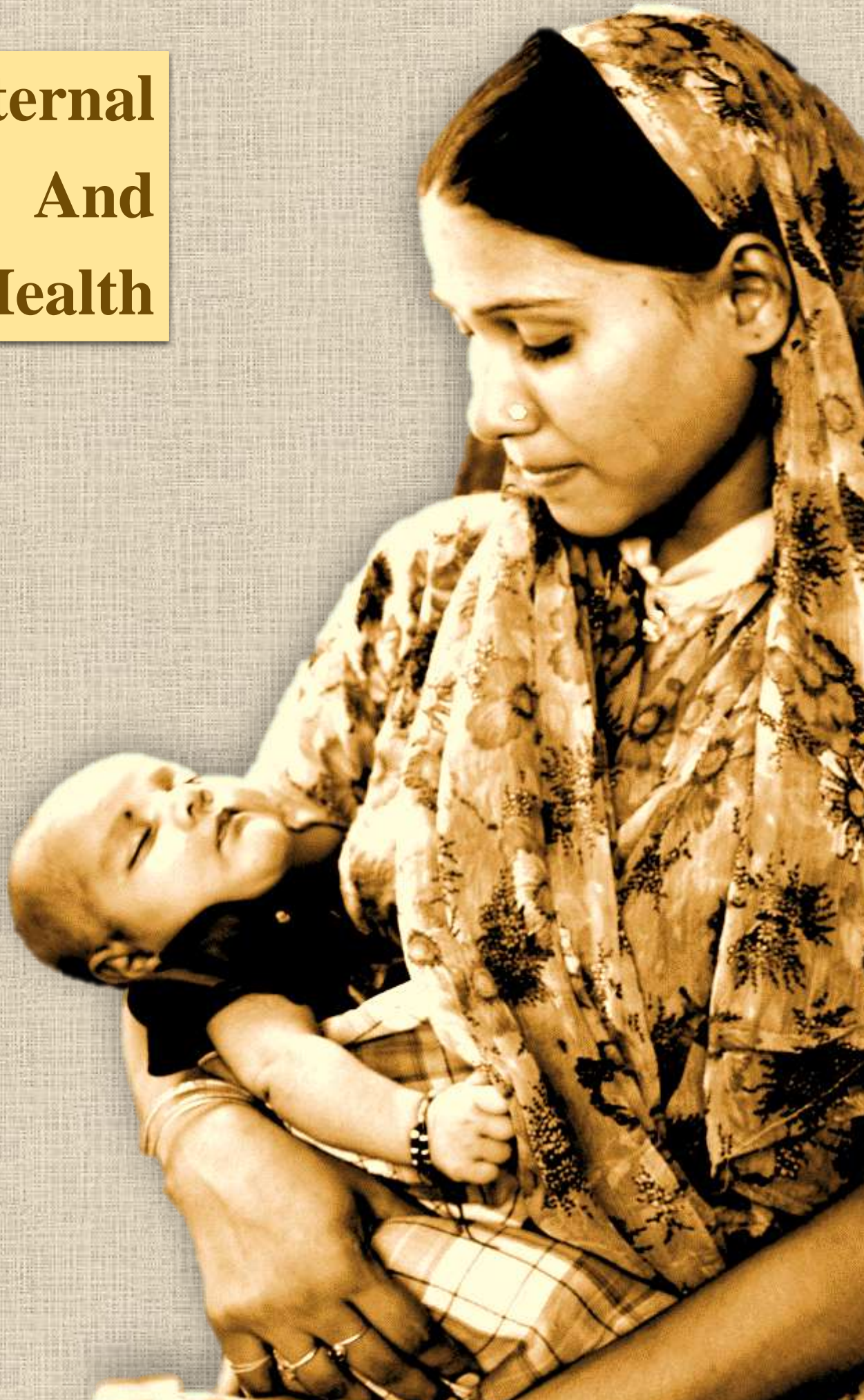

# Maternal And Child Health





Mother and Child health is a very important area where extensive work is required, Centre for Integrated Development is working for the improvement in maternal and child health.

Centre for Integrated Development is working with the primitive tribe Sahariya to improve the status of their maternal and child health and to strengthen adolescents so that they do not have to suffer with complexity during their age of fertility. The project is in its third year and have yielded wonderful result and it has been a catalyst in bringing the change in the life of the Sahariya. However the focus was on the Sahariya tribe the project is also involved in the development of the other marginalized communities of the region.

### **Community Based Nutrition Rehabilitation Centre**

CID is working with Sahariya tribe and other marginalized community in Kolaras block of Shivpuri district; Malnutrition is very prevalent in this tribal community, thus we intervene with the community based Nutritional Rehabilitation Centres, CNRC is a community based approach towards the managing nutritive support to children and to decrease the prevalence of disease or health event occurred by malnutrition. This approach is not only an effective tool to address malnutrition, but also an effective means of sensitization.

There are 450 stories of children coming out of the state of malnourished, Pooja is one of such story, Pooja, 11 month old girl was examined by the CID team and they found that the child is in very critical condition with only 3kg weight and MUAC 7cm. Girl needed immediate attention, our team has informed the concerned authority about the children, ambulance were called, meanwhile women and child development department official reached the place, since there was a delay in ambulance, WCD officer has taken the child to the Shivpuri in her own vehicle along with the program coordinator of CID. After the rehabilitation period at NRC weight of girl increased to 4.1kg and MUAC increased to 10cm from 7cm. though she is still recovering of lost health but her life is not at the edge.





# Vitamin A supplementation

In MP, Vitamin A is being provided to 9-59 month old children biannually through biannual child health months (Bal Suraksha Maah) (BSM) using the existing 'fixed day/fixed site' outreach service known as Village Health and Nutrition Days (VHND). In order to address the deficiency of Micronutrient among under 5 children; Centre for Integrated Development is sharing hand with Micronutrient Initiative India in Madhya Pradesh to promote essential micronutrient like Vitamin A and other micronutrients like Iron, zinc and Albendazole etc.

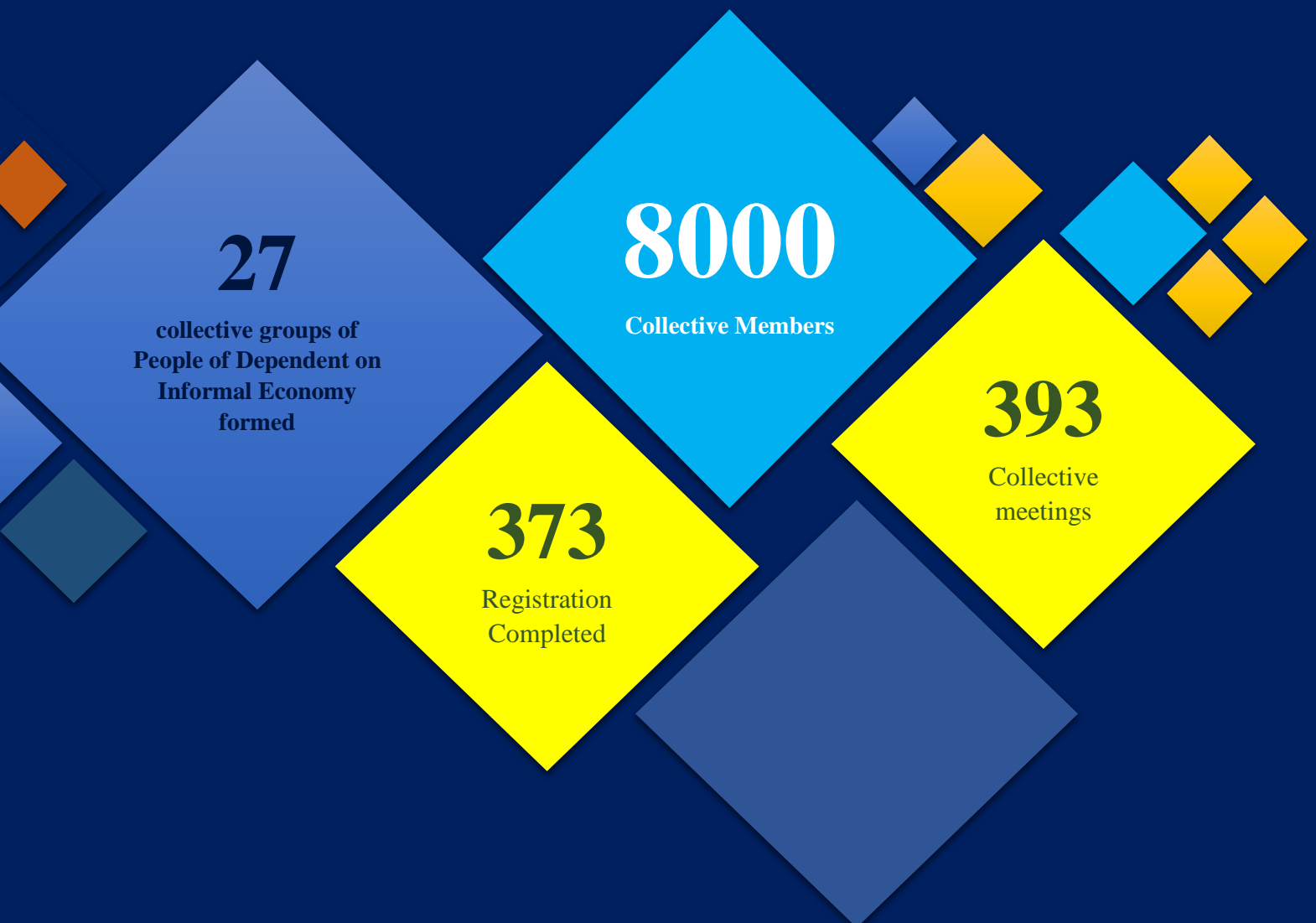
# Livelihood

Poverty is a big issue India is facing, In Madhya Pradesh the situation is even worse, according to Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment 42.1 percent population fall under BPL category in urban settings. Centre for Integrated Development is working on poverty in the urban slums of Gwalior and Indore. Centre for Integrated Development works mainly with the women and people dependent on informal economy. In our mission to mitigate poverty from society TDH Suisse, EC-Action Aid, CBM are our partners. We are working with an approach where we are providing and facilitating skill development as well as we are linking the eligible people with the available government schemes. By this approach we double strike on poverty to break the shackles fast.



## Collectives

Collective are the group of people who works in informal sectors. Regular meeting of these collectives are being organized. These collective capacitated on various entitlements and rights of the people who works in informal sectors. These collectives are included people who work in informal sectors like Domestic women, Workers, Construction workers, Street Vendors, Bidi Rollers, Carpet weavers. Members of these collectives are also being registered with the concern government body so that they can avail the benefits.





## **Cross sectorial meeting**

The objective of these meeting was to develop the communication bridge between different sectors of the PIE, the cross sectorial communication will help to build bond between them which will develop sense of unity among them. Cross sectorial communication allows them to learn from each other about the issues and way to addressed them.

## **Resource Centre / Facilitation centre**

Centre for Integrated Development worked in many slums, in these slums resource centre has been developed, the aim to develop these resource centre to provide a facility in their locality where they can have access to all the information required to initiate action to avail the entitlements. These centre are also being used to disseminate the information among the community. All the application forms required for registration are kept at these centres so that community people do not have to knock the doors of offices just to get the forms. With forming the resource centre in the localities has developed a trust among the community, while having the resource centre we ensuring a help always available for the people of the community.

## **Campaign**

Campaigns are one of the effective means of mass awareness, Centre for integrated development have run many campaign successfully in past, since Gwalior and Indore have large number of PIEs and all of them cannot be involved in to the project directly due to limitation of the project campaign has been executed to overcome this deficit. Many campaign has been run during the reported year.

To spread awareness about the social security schemes a campaign has been run in Indore and Gwalior, in this campaign the medium of the information was street plays, street plays was performed in locality, play was informative at the same time was equipped with humour to which the community was able to relate easily.

## Self Help Group

SHGs have been known as the tool to empower women, CID also have adopted this tool. The ultimate purpose of forming SHG groups is to improve the livelihood option for the community while the approach has been different over the different communities. In a community where child labor is prevalent SHGs have been modified in order to keep child labor eradication in focus therefore 80% members of these groups are the mothers of child labor or any other female members of the family where child labor exists, members of these groups are being oriented to support the education of their children through their savings. In other community the approach is modified to keep empowerment of PWD in focus. Vocational training has also been facilitated through the different training agencies. Women have been provided training of various trades.

People with disabilities are most vulnerable and least empowered groups. All too often they are neglected, discriminated and excluded from mainstream development initiatives, and find it difficult to access health, education, housing and livelihood opportunities. This results in greater poverty.

Centre for Integrated Development (CID) is working to promote inclusion and participation of persons with disabilities in development and decision making process through comprehensive Community Based Rehabilitation.

For the inclusive development of the person with disability CID works with a multi-dimensional approach where all the cross cutting issues are being focused and addressed in order to achieve the inclusive development of the persons with disability.

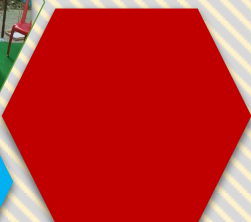
