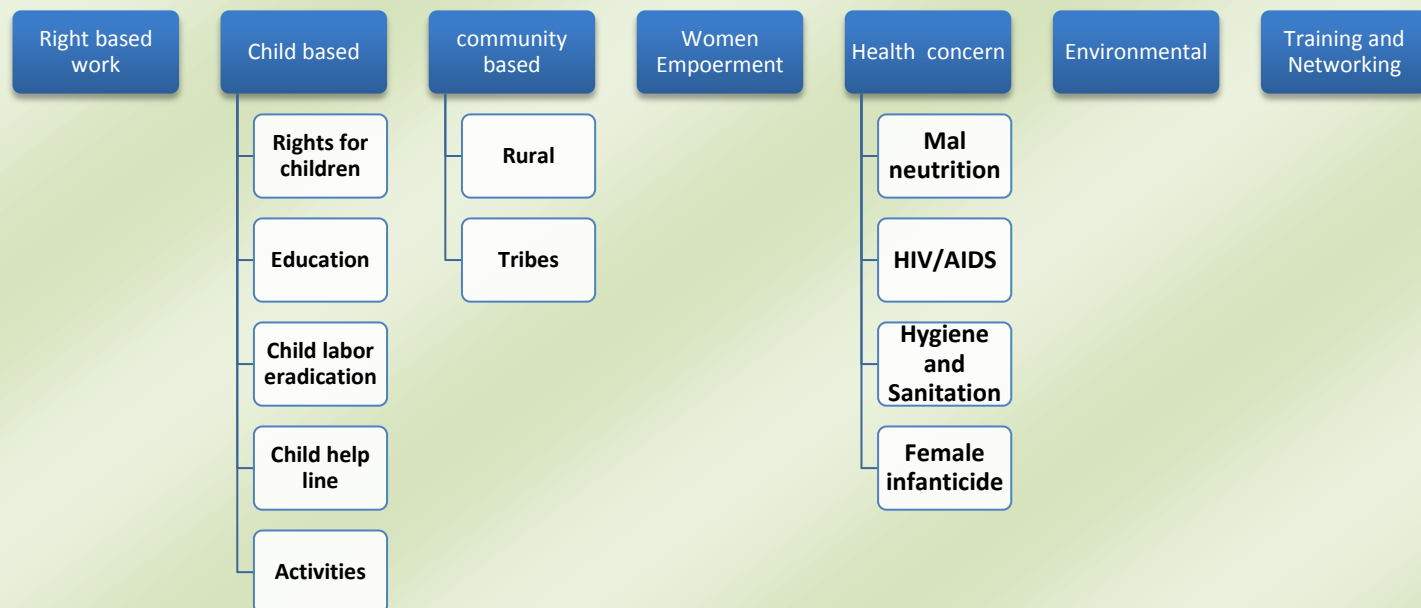


Drawing competition during children activities

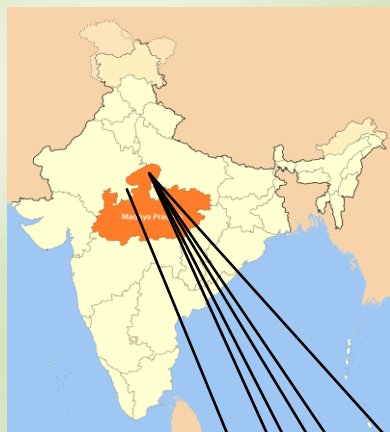

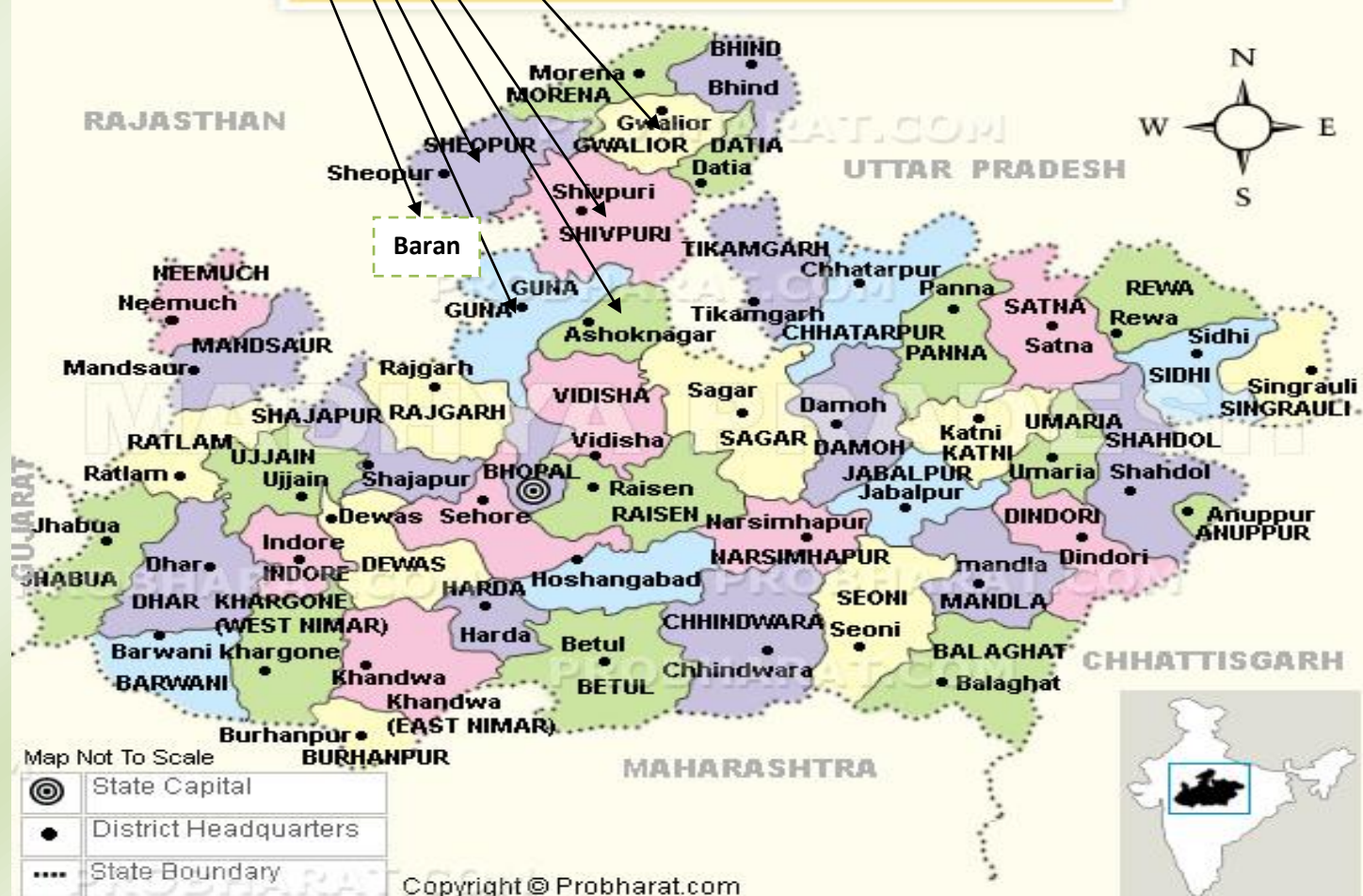

In these sectors , we found many of problematic issue especially regarding to Sahariya tribes and rural area. As soon as we found this , we took immediate initial towards its treatment .

Education: Developing perspectives for the future

To grant essential and basic education to deprived children is most important part of our organization; they are considered as future of any nation, if plant would be strong by root, it can take a huge and rapid growth similarly it is essential for the child to keep their root rigid to grow healthier. We are working with different sort of communities to take initial for children like rag picker, carpet workers, children from slums and children from rural and backward class too.

In Gwalior Education Centre for Children are being operated in 3 targeted community like rag picker , stone crusher and carpet sector to provide an child friendly environment for full and harmonious development of deprived children who are engaged in different economical activities. CID appoints sufficient number of qualified and committed teachers who are able to deliver quality education to those children. Hereby CID try to equip these children with distinct skills and good quality of education so they can be mainstreamed in education as well as in society.

Gwalior



“Campaign to raise voice spreading literacy”

School is best place for children in order to develop and ensuring their bright future. If children are not in school then they are most vulnerable for become child



labor. Keeping this in consideration CID runs “SCHOOL CHALO ABHIYAN” in child labor dominated area such as abadpura, khjanchibaba, noorganj etc. to enroll children in to regular schooling. In the current year the effort to enroll children in schools was instigated from 10th April and it was carried on till the end of July. This campaign brought good result and the number of children from target area getting enrolled into

regular school is increasing steadily. This year 321 boys and 302 girls students were admitted in to formal schools in Gwalior.

- At district shyopur, CID conducted this Campaign in 10 covered villages. Under this campaign CID conducted wall writing, Rallies, street play, songs on education, meetings to aware villagers on the issue of Education, our team members also contacted personally with community through one to one approach. CID team also visited families of the children those are not enrolled in schools. Despite campaign of government 79 children (34Boys + 45 Girls) have left without enrolled in their village school. Due to combined efforts of community and project team 79 children have been enrolled in schools. Now Most of the children are enrolled within coverage area. In meetings with community under SCA some important issues have been discussed such as- importance of education, right to education, Mid day meal, about aganwadi centers to develop understanding of community on these issues.
- *At Kolaras block of district Shivpuri, we selected 75 villages instead of 60 selected villages under school chalo campaign, the effect was splendid so damn that we assure to connect 4370 children to school and gave information about hand washing. This activity is doing on our target 6403 children.*

Hamara school programme is being undertaken by Centre for Integrated Development with support of India Literacy Project in ten villages of Vijaipur block of Sheopur district of Madhya Pradesh. Sheopur district is one of the most backward district of Madhya Pradesh having very tuff geographical

conditions large tribal population. Through this project CID is covering age group of 0 to 18 years. Total targeted children are 2183 (Girls 1008 + 1175 Boys).

Considering education as a dire need of present scenario, we are trying to enhance our step and day by day putting our whole effort to place our best shot for those flowers who are deprived for essential needs for their development.

CID also observed various trouble during execute aanganwari at many villages, to get rid with this trouble we established community centre and give essential information to community for successful execution of aangan wari. Now we are cooperating with various aaganwari at almost over all interventional area of CID.



In the Govt- Schools Books are provided by government so CID provided learning material for students such as slats to 100 children, copies to 800 and pencils to 220 children so they study in better way. Hence CID provided assistance to more than 1020 poor children.

In August CID team list up all 8 villages children from 0 to 6 year age group from vijaypur sector and found there are 62 children who were not enrolled in any Aganwadi. Then CID team made effort to enroll all children in Aganwadi. Later on all children have been enrolled.

Health: The Essential Needs



Every year more than 9 million children die before they reach their fifth birthday. Seven out of ten of these deaths are due to preventable and treatable diseases. Many of these deaths could be avoided if the children received timely and appropriate care. More than one-quarter of children in developing regions are under-weight for their age.

According to UNAIDS, an estimated 33.4 million people live with HIV/AIDS worldwide, of whom about 2.1 million are children under 15 years of age. Roughly 17.5 million children under the age of 18 have lost one or both parents to AIDS, and millions more have been affected by a vastly increased risk of poverty, homelessness, school dropout, discrimination and illness.

CID runs projects around the MP and Rajasthan to offer preventive and curative health care targeting mothers and Children. A major objective is to ensure that remote populations have access to this care. CID has set up specialized health care and nutrition rehabilitation centre centers to treat several diseases and it also runs educational programmes to promote safe hygiene and other preventive measures. CID also runs nutrition projects for young children as well as mother and child health care services.

CID remains highly engaged in supporting HIV/AIDS victims. Direct help to infected children is provided through care-access implementation programmes. In addition, programmes are run to avoid social exclusion and provide psychosocial support to victims and their relatives. For affected children, projects are centered on providing psychosocial support as well as material help to orphans. CID also works to prevent infection and minimize prejudice, by increasing awareness and understanding of different concerned issues.

CID regularly organizes awareness programs in different target groups on different health concern issue like health checkup camp, classes for health and sanitation, HIV/AIDS prevention and care, Eye camp etc. We assume that without awaking the society, it is impossible to plant permanent effect so we always try to aware them through different innovative way especially in tribal, rural and backward communities. CID undertook monthly health checkup camps for children at each center for providing medical support to children and create awareness on health, hygiene and sanitation. During this period over 60 health checkup camps have been successfully organized by CID. Most commonly found problems among children are skin infections, viral fever, cough, eye flue, malaria, malnutrition, minor injuries and wounds.

Having observe minutely, we found that many of backward community and especially in sahariya tribes is not aware the way of health and sanitation and many killing deceases which generates in deficiency of sanitation awareness. We are putting our focus other different aspect of health concern issue like female feticide, mal nutrition, Pulse polio campaign, HIV/AIDS and etc. We are establishing nutrition rehabilitation centre in villages and backwards area with the kind cooperation of local administration. We aware them through Nukkad , Training camp, publishing material and through different small fair.



Behavior Change through Communication with community Programme

We are working keeping various aspect of hygiene and sanitation in concentration to aware community from this essential require of their routine livelihood, taking a effective step in this direction we start work under behavior change and communication programme with UNICEF at Kolaras block of district Shivpuri. This programme has proved a milestone step for this issue .

There are a working plan initialized taking over 60 villages in a view during a meeting of all respective and related officer of block in behavior change communication programme organized by centre for integrated development having a view for S.C. & S.T. community at the kolaras block with the co operation of UNICEF Bhopal and distric administration shivpuri. The main issue of this meet is girls education, breast feeding, Hand washing, H.I.V. AIDS., diarrhea, vaccination. Above issue are co related with all of programme ex. Mangal divas, school chalo abhiyan, Children day, pulse polio movement, village health and nutrition day whom with we are running successfully.



These programmes are running on 38470 population of 8630 families of selected 60 village included 17995 woman and 20475 man. These 8630 families are categorized in 511 belongs from general, 3692 from obc's, 1707 from S.C. and 2720 from S.T. in this programme. A block coordinator is appointed who will make a good work plan to give perfection and creative direction for this objective having support and guidance of organization head and it has selected 6 volunteer called community coordinator on 60 villages (1 volunteer per 10 village) to make successful accomplishment for this programme. Because the entire programme is running for mother and children therefore it needed a woman trainer to give splendid direction for breast feeding and appropriate vaccination and it is appointed a block training co coordinator who would be able to give guidance and direction to villagers. There are 120 volunteer (60 man and 60 woman) is selected on village level as strong bond of our programme. It has taken on focus to all

activities government on village level to give 100 definite accomplishments for programme.

A few activities and its output related BCC programme is given below:-

I.P.C.

This activities is considered as most successful activities of our programme . Through this we communicate to 2365 pregnant woman whom we gave information of sanitation before maternity And give direction to 437 mother to take precaution for baby feed through mother for first hour only, baby feed for first six month and all detail information about vaccination.

- We counseled to 2206 mother of those children whose age is below then six month about nutrition, health, sanitation and vaccination.
- We counseled to 1301 girl who was irregular to school and their parent about importance of education and schooling.
- On H.I.V. and AIDS issue, we gave information to 5394 man and 2843 woman about H.I.V. and AIDS and safety and precaution from this killing virus and disease. In this issue, we got success to send over 359 boys and 205 girls to I.C.T.C.

Issue based meeting

- We got success to aware and carry our message about breastfeeding issue and girl education to 4606 and 4600 villager respectively in this monthly issue based meet at community. We gave information about hand washing issue to 8139 person and 5809 person are made aware on H.I.V. issue. We are successful to give direction about vaccination and diarrhea to 3497 and 2983 villagers respectively to respective issue. Over all we made successful achievement to connect over 30792 person out of 38470 of population from any of one issue and make a part of programme .

Group meeting

The more of group and youth group are been connect with our programme, in which we took monthly meeting with 218 youth group and 306 woman based group through which we are able to carry our message over 50-60 percent of people. In this continuity, we are focusing on child group, teenage group, parent and teacher union and village health organization. AND We gave priority to child group and arranged over 260 meeting with them on direct them about how to and when to do hand washing issue.

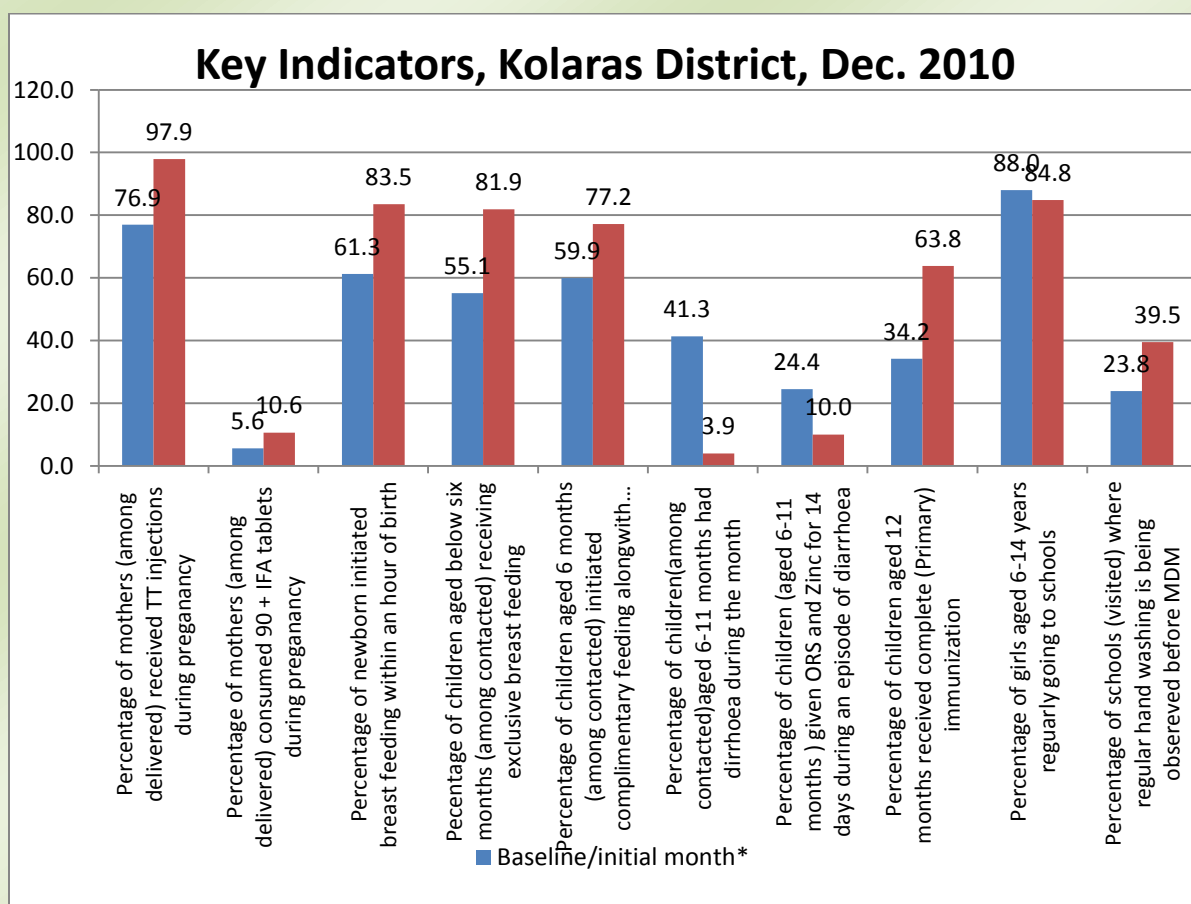
Village health and nutrition day

At kolaras block , we performed initiate with administration. This activity is easiest way to act with governmental substance. We are cooperating with administration to help mother and children and got success to win heart of community. We are developing so called doctor at every home. It is equally evaluating us to cooperate and evaluating with this programme. We gave cooperating evolution to that 5 village where villager was unaware from vaccination but now they are secure due to regular vaccination after our overlooking upon them. Now we are initiating with 34 Village out of 54 villages under village health and nutrition day.

Special activities:-

- **Breast feeding weak:-** *We counseled to woman of selected village about importance of breast feeding and to give value of their respect and honor. We appreciate to those women who always used to regular breastfeeding to their child below 6 month. We gave respect over 47 selected woman of this issue. We tried to make aware over 4851 woman in which 991 women got aware. This movement was too much appreciable.*
- **Hand wash Activities:-** *In this activities we made some little child group of those children who was able to make good communication from selected village and connect each group to every 5 or 10 families. Every group visited other families of village and gave information about hand wash. we awaked over 2589 person from 592 families and through 1249 demonstration by connecting 35 school with the cooperation of B.R.C.C. and B.E.O.*
- **During children day programme:-** *To initialize this Programme successfully, We decided to appreciate those students who were regular in school during july-november session. During this programme, we organized some competitive act like marathon, Drawing, Questionnaires, and many more and we gave award on activity wise. During this we selected 595 best children from 12 schools and awarded them.*

- H.I.V./ AIDS Programme:-**
During this activities we decided to apply new direction to go ahead with community and students too. We tried to make this day interesting, we made two team named “HIV and AIDS” of our group and give information to all youth. They tried to have entire information and knowledge regarding this issue.



Community Empowerment: A grass root need for an earth of humanity

CID with firm determination of making change has taken huge leading step for different deprived huge population especially from rural region and tribe based community. We took our primary step with rural community for environmental changes at village Guthina, gradually we initiated with backward community of Gwalior district, We work with SHG and support to establish them through many ways , now having a great experience to empowering, we are working with sahariyas of different province and grouped them as a community based organization named SAJAG. We support to community to make them aware from different government scheme and give them proper guidance to get access those schemes. As per Our core vision and objective we are stepping rapidly to make big changes in key behavior of target community.

Village level community meetings

During act at block Vijaypur we are trying to sensitize community to focus on education of children through community meetings. These meetings now bringing result in order to ensuring qualitative education. Joint efforts are being made by community people. In all targeted villages community meeting has been held every month. Total 132 meetings have been organized in this period. In these meetings average 20-30 community people participated and following issues are discussed:-

1. Regularity of teachers.
2. Appointment of teachers.
3. Attendance of children in schools.
4. Regularization of Mid day meal.
5. Role of parents in education of Children
6. Importance of Education
7. Regularization of Aganwadi.

Communities' members not only discuss on these issues but also take part in joint actions. Most of the applications are prepared and signed by the community members in these meetings. For instance IN Danganpura village community member not only submitted their application Gram Sabha but also they went at block to submit application for opening Aganwadi in their village. Some Community members are sensitive regarding education of their children and they start participating in joint actions. Now parents are little bit serious about education and send their children in school but earlier they were not very will full to send and educate their children Through these meetings we try to develop level of consciousness of community about education of their children.

Community Empowerment

At Vijaypur block, Over 132 community meetings have been carried out. In these meetings 864 male and 390 female participated. In community meetings following issues are discussed-: importance of education, Right to education

- Regularise government teachers (Due to efforts of community Teacher of Nayagaon, Khalai and durande became regular).
- Made efforts for infrastructural development of Schools.
(Building for Baraid and Aganwadi centre for Meghpura, Paira, Kirvara have been sanctioned due to efforts of community
- Made community sensitize about education of their children.
- Regularize Mid day Meal.
- Regularize education system of government.

COMMUNITY COMMITTEE

The Formed communities Committees are working with the objective to organize community at grass root level, create awareness about issues related to community itself and provide them platform to raise their voice for their concern, rights and justice before Concern authorities.

To update the communities about the happenings and different government schemes for the poor and deprived section of the society. Every month a meeting for each of the community committee is organized. At present there are 32 community committees are active with total number of 1258 members.

SELF HELP GROUP (SHGs)

At the same time to strengthen the community economically and aware them on different issues, for up gradation of leadership quality Self Help Groups have been formed. SHGs are meant to stabilize the economic strength of its members and empower them as most of its members are women. To deposit savings and resolve any unsettled issues at least one meeting in a month is organized for all the SHGs. At the end of this year only in Gwalior total 41 SHGs are running smoothly.

CID is rendering its services apart of projects limitation. We are acting on various kind of social issue like women empowerment, female feticide, environmental etc. so we keep our self ready always for any such kind of changes against required social problem.

Celebration of Independence Day (15th August)

On 15th August, we celebrated Independence Day of India in all centers. Guests from the local community were invited to initiate the programme. At all the centers programme was instigated with flag hosting followed by the national Anthem. After the national anthem children were enlightened about this day and were also explained why this day is celebrated by every Indian. With some cultural program ,poems plays and songs by the children the programme came to an end with snacks and sweets distribution to children .

Celebration of Child Rights Week

CID celebrated child rights week between 14th to 20th November 2010, Child Right's week start from on 14th November, that birth date of India's first P.M. Jawaharlal Nehru, is generally celebrated as 'Children's Day" in India. An exhibition was displayed at "PHOOLBAGH" Gwalior a central place of city to aware on child rights (Right to Survival, Development, Protection and Participation). Prime objective of the exhibition was to impart information and create awareness among general public about Child Rights. about 3000 people visited this exhibition.

There were some competition also organized such as drawing competitions at all centers, different picture made by Student on child rights and displayed their basic rights through drawings.

Celebration of Child Right Convention



At the end of child right week and on the occasion of world child right day CID also organized regional level child right convention program. In which there were two hundred fifty member participated form Shivpuri, Ashokenagar, Guna, Sheopur and Gwalior districts BAL PANCHAYAT. Mr. Pradhuman Singh Tomar (MLA, Gwalior), Mr. APS Chauhan HOD Political Department, Jiwiji University Gwalior, Dr. Sanjay Singh (Professor MLB Collage Gwalior), Dr. R.J. Rao, Dr. Vivek Bapat. (Jiwaji University) Dr. Vijay Gupta, Mr. Umesh Vashishtha and large number of media and socially sensitive people participated in this programme.

Celebration of “World AIDS Day”

CID regularly organise awareness programs in different target groups on HIV/AIDS prevention and care. On the occasion of “World AIDS Day” (1st December) CID organized an awareness program at Noorganj. There were 74 participant took participation. Anganwadi Workers Training

Aanganwadi workers training have been organized with help of women and child development department from 21st dec to 22 dec 2010. This training was focused on malnutrition and pre school education. 32 Aanganwadi workers (AW) and Assistant Aanganwadi workers participated in this training. After complain regarding malfunctioning of Aanganwadi Centers in NCPCR Aanganwadi workers and senior officer of WCD department was focused malnutrition , preschool education remained unaddressed. Then in month of November 2010 we talked with senior officers of WCD about conducting training of Malnutrition but they were not agreed earlier after constant communication they were ready to conduct this type of training focused on Malnutrition and Pre school education. Two resource persons came from WCD department itself such as Block officer and supervisor. They both cover Malnutrition subject. Block officer of WCD

department over all tried to develop understanding of Aanganwadi workers about their role.

Project coordinator Mr. Pawan singh Bhadoria and Neera Soni (She worked with WCD department) cover issue of Pre school education. 30 Aanganwadi worker and Assistant Aanganwadi workers attend this training. At last a Joint work plan have been chalked out by CID team and Aanganwadi workers (AW) for imparting pre school education. It was decided in early stage CID team members will give two hours daily at Aanganwadi for supporting AW in imparting pre school education to children. CID also provided preschool education material

Staff training

19 to 21 June 2010 Training was organized by CID in Gwalior for teachers. In which all the six teachers and coordinator participated. Training was impart by Mr Ravi Thakur, Resource Person from State Resource Centre for Education Bhopal. In this training teachers were trained How to find out solutions for the problem faced during teaching, How to make teaching interesting through songs and games, To prepare teaching learning material and teaching methodology.

Now teachers are better equipped as given tips how to teach and how to develop education teaching learning material along with they also learn games and different activities to impart education in interesting manner.
